#### Please provide a brief summary of your role, the project you are supporting and the type of work you undertake on a daily basis:

I am a Technical Trainee in my first year at Balfour Beatty, based in the Huntly Road office.

So far I have worked in two departments. In Engineering I worked for Dougie Campbell, Project Manager, on the Abbey Wood 33kV Substation Switchboard. This included a whole range of things from sourcing material to making sure troughing sizes were accurate so that they could accommodate the cables being put through the trough.

Following six months in Engineering I am now working for Chris Devine and John Murray, Senior Quantity Surveyors. Most of the time I am working on Chris's job: SSR 3A. This entails having to make sure all weekly timesheets are uploaded and accurate, managing costs and updating cash flows. With all the different tasks I am always learning and kept up to date with what is going on.
