<u>YF</u>: Last Friday we had a fun afternoon experimenting with lots of science activities. We have continued to talk about it this week and experiment further. In maths this week we have been talking about time. As well as reading clock faces, we have been looking at seasons and months. <u>Y1</u>: This week year 1 have been learning about time including days of the week, o'clock and half past. We have been plotting events in time diaries. We have been writing about castle careers. We have been learning about the real meaning of Easter - new life and new beginnings. Our topic next term is turtles so if you do any beach combing over Easter - please bring in your treasures for our aquarium role plays.

<u>Y2</u>: We have been finishing off our topic on toys and reviewing our learning. We have been enjoying some fun Easter art and craft activities!

<u>Y3</u>: This week in year three we have continued to make vehicles and trailers in DT. We connected them with magnets and used weights in the trailer to test the magnets strength in science. In English we have been working on writing spectacular sentences, this week we have learnt about conjunctions and how to use commas correctly. Sadly this was the last week of the Maynard's sports leaders visiting us; the children had a great last session using a parachute for some fun activities.

<u>Y4</u>: We enjoyed working alongside Keir, our school builders to design and make bridges as a team building activity, it was great fun! We have been using animation clips to inspire our writing in Literacy and in Maths we have been learning about equivalent fractions. Next half term our topic will be 'Groovy Greeks' - look out for the home learning suggestions in your child's Home Learning book.
