Construction of the Acute Services Block (ASB)

Good progress has continued on the ASB building. The Concrete Frame is now complete and the Facade elements are well advanced. This includes masonry, windows, curtain walling and rain-screen cladding.



Internal Fabric & Finishes are now well underway including the M&E Installations that are one of the most important systems in the building. Fitted furniture and internal glazed screens will be starting in the next few weeks.
